

Dream of a Black Hole

Artwork Description

"Dream of a Black Hole" is an abstract work that explores the theme of invisible forces-those that pull, consume, and reshape everything in their path.

The deep black at the center of the canvas represents a black hole, while the flowing waves of gold, blue, red, and white express thoughts and emotions being drawn inward.

However, this "black hole" is not a symbol of destruction. By adding the word "dream" to the title, the piece transforms into something more intimate, even nostalgic. It invites the viewer to surrender to the pull, to experience a surreal space where silence and movement coexist in harmony.

Concept / Background

At the time of creation, I was reflecting on the theme of "how we face the uncontrollable."

Whether it's time, transformation, or overwhelming emotion, some forces cannot be resisted.

This painting was born from that contemplation-the idea that in surrendering to the flow, we may discover a new kind of freedom.

By redefining the black hole not as a point of destruction but as a place of rebirth, I aimed to explore the potential for inner reconstruction through dreams.

Technique & Materials

This piece was created using the acrylic pouring technique-a method where paint is not brushed on but rather poured and allowed to flow, letting gravity and surface tension guide the composition.

Using a base of black and metallic gold, layered with blue, pink, and white, I created natural gradients and swirling movements that evoke a cosmic sense of scale.

Because pouring is largely uncontrollable once it begins, this technique demands a balance between intuition and surrender-a fitting metaphor for the theme of the piece itself.

Artist's Message

This work is intentionally open to interpretation.

Some may feel a sense of being pulled inward, others may sense calm or unease, or even a quiet resonance with their subconscious.

Whatever you see, I hope this piece serves as a mirror to your "inner universe."

If "Dream of a Black Hole" stirs something within you, then this work has fulfilled its purpose.
